Unbury Your Bullseye: Important Beliefs

Matthew 7:13-14 New International Version

“Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it.



Essential: Necessary for salvation and restoration in Christ.

Important: Vital to a healthy and growing relationship with God.

Personal: Things that are significant to you but not necessarily essential or important.

ESSENTIAL BELIEFS

- It is essential that a Christian believes that GOD exists.
- It is essential that a Christian believes JESUS is Lord and the risen Savior.
- It is essential that a Christian believes we are born again by the HOLY SPIRIT.
- It is essential that a Christian believes God was the FATHER of Jesus and revealed himself as the spiritual FATHER of all who put their faith in Him.
- It is essential that a Christian believes that the BIBLE is God’s word to us.
- It is essential that a Christian believes that all PEOPLE are made in the spiritual image of God.
- It is essential that a Christian believes that we will exist for ETERNITY with God in heaven or separated from God in hell.
- It is essential that a Christian believes every Christian is called to FULL TIME Christian service.
- It is essential that a Christian believes we are SAVED by God’s grace through faith and not by any human effort.

Essential: Why we believe what we believe.

Important: Who we are becoming in Christ.

Personal: What we do and how we do it.

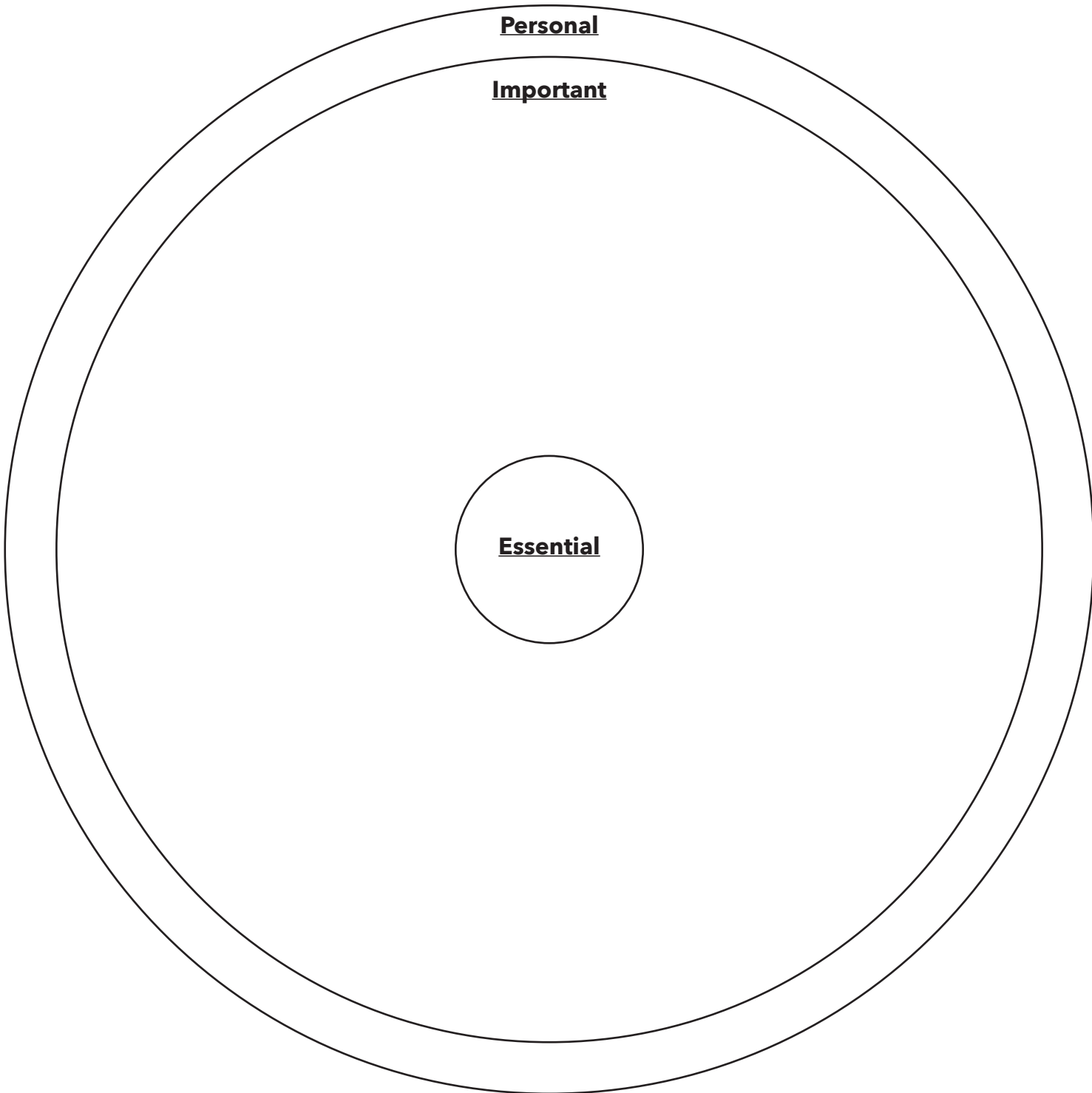
Matthew 5:13-16 New International Version

“You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot.

“You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

Matthew 7:24-27 New International Version

“Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock. But everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man who built his house on sand. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell with a great crash.”



Galatians 5:13-26 New International Version

You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love. For the entire law is fulfilled in keeping this one command: "Love your neighbor as yourself." If you bite and devour each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other. So I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh. For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit, and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh. They are in conflict with each other, so that you are not to do whatever you want. But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. The acts of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery; idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions and envy; drunkenness, orgies, and the like. I warn you, as I did before, that those who live like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other.

Home Group Notes

Pray: It is always good by having someone begin group with prayer and invite the Spirit to join in on your group. (It may help to ask someone else ahead of time, some people like to prepare.)

Intro: If haven't already write down what beliefs you think are important in Christianity, and particularly the character that we Christians as supposed to develop. Then share with each other what you wrote?

Questions: These questions are merely meant as a discussion tool. If it sparks a fruitful conversation, let it carry on. By no means feel bound to answer everything or stick only to these questions. Read them ahead of time and let the Spirit guide you how to use them for your group.

- Have you experienced or noticed God changing your character? When/how did you notice? What was being changed in you and how was it being changed?
- What are you already good at character wise? Which ones do you feel you already are doing well in? (if you feel uncomfortable talking about yourself, maybe share something about the person next to you and what you feel they are already good at.)
- What character would you like to develop most and why?

Pray Again: You can never pray too much, but this is a good time to ask if there are anything the group can be praying for. Leaders, be sure to take some notes and pray for your groups throughout the week. Don't forget to follow up with each other when you see God working and answering prayers.
